#### **2025 CALL FOR PROPOSALS**

The From Poverty to Possibility priority area will invest in programs throughout Niagara that address issues of food security, housing stability and income stability.

#### **ISSUE**

The economic impact of high inflation and rising cost of living has been damaging to many individuals and families. Now more than ever, Niagara is facing hunger and poverty among its citizens. From Poverty to Possibility funding will focus on immediate relief of poverty as well as longer term programming to help break the cycle of poverty over time.

#### **FUNDING OVERVIEW**

Through From Poverty to Possibility funding, United Way Niagara will provide three-year funding for programs and services that provide immediate relief for the effects of poverty, as well as longer term solutions to break the cycle of poverty.

United Way Niagara is committed to centering equity in all that we do. We will implement a Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, Accessibility & Indigenous Collaboration (DEIA & IC) framework and equitable systems and practices that are representative of the local community.



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#### **FUNDING GOAL**

The goal of this priority area is to meet basic human needs and help break the cycle of poverty.

#### **FUNDING OUTCOMES**

Through this funding stream, programs that contribute to the following Aligned Outcomes will be supported:

**Improved Food Security** 

**Increased Income Stability** 

**Improved Housing Stability** 

Programs that align with this category will address one or more of the following Program Outcomes:

Increased access to nutritious and culturally appropriate food

Improved life skills

More unhoused people become housed

Increased access to emergency food

Increased employment readiness

**Increased housing retention** 

To be eligible for funding, programs must address one or more of the **United Nations Sustainable Development Goals**.

#### PRIORITY AREA PROGRAM EXAMPLES:

- Community Meal Programs
- Housing Support Programs
- Housing Stabilization Programs

- Life Skills Programs
- Emergency Food Programs

#### **TIMELINE**

There is a two-step application process. The first step is the Letter of Intent (LOI), that will be available on the United Way Niagara website on January 4, 2025. Successful applicants to the LOI will then be invited to submit a full application, which will be available in February 2025. Funding for successful applicants will begin in April 2026.
